Dr. John Eldon Neihof, Jr. is an ordained elder in the Kentucky Mountain Holiness Association and has been a member of KMHA since 1991. John’s expanding evangelistic ministry has taken him to 14 states, 20 denominations and 14 interdenominational fellowships. John loves to laugh, sing and preach. 
