REST AND ABIDE

This is a day of upheaval and chaos. There are wars around the world: Ukraine, Sudan, Israel, Congo, Myanmar. Here in our own country we have political unrest, as some see the purpose of government to protect our freedoms, and others see its purpose as taking care of us. We have cultural unrest as well, as some people seek to deny God-given biological

nature, and generally deny that there is any creation principle that we humans cannot alter. Even in nature there seems to be chaos: massive wildfires, devastating hurricanes, howling blizzards. All this being so, it is very easy for us to come to live in a constant state of anxiety. What will happen next? What will come apart next? Who will do what next?

It certainly was that way for the ancient Israelites. Their lives had been pretty stable: "Make more bricks!" Now everything was up in the air. They were out in this howling desert, headed toward a place where none of them had ever been before, where they had to depend on food dropped from heaven (suppose one day there wasn't any?), where they had to struggle from one undependable water hole to the next. Rest? Hardly!

But what does God say? Moses saw it clearly and spoke of it as something already done. ""With your unfailing love you lead the people you have redeemed. In your might, you guide them to your sacred home (Exod. 15:13 NLT). That word translated "home" connotes "resting place," a place to settle down, a place to abide in. As is normal in the Old Testament, God uses physical things to convey spiritual truths (think of circumcision). So Moses is thinking of the land of Canaan, a place where the Israelites could stop wandering around, and could, with a sigh of satisfaction, rest. So what is the spiritual truth that the land of Canaan was pointing to? The writer to the Hebrews caught it: "Now if Joshua had succeeded in giving them this rest, God would not have spoken about another day of rest still to come. So there is a special rest still waiting for the people of God. For all who have entered into God's rest have rested from their labors, just as God did after creating the world (Heb. 4:8-10 NLT). What is he talking about? He is talking about the message of Peniel: every person is intended to come to that place of complete surrender and absolute trust where it is God who is working in their lives and not they themselves. We have surrendered our desires and our wills and are His completely. We can settle down in, abide in, him, knowing he does all things well (however they might look to us), and REST. Is that a reality for you? It can be.

Counselors wanted


