

Preaching Evangelists

MIKE ADAMS



Michael Adams is a full-time, tenured evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene. He pastored churches for 21 years and has

served as an evangelist for 29 years. His ministry has taken he and his wife, Elizabeth, across the United States in revivals, camp meetings, retreats, missionary tours, faith promise weekends, banquets, youth camps and special evangelistic services.

He has ministered extensively in evangelism in Mexico, Canada, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Spain, Ukraine, Kenya, Tanzania, England and Uganda. His desire is to bring revivalism and evangelism to the church through a preaching style that is Bible based, relevant and frequently humorous to connect and communicate. His preaching encompasses the gospel of full salvation and scriptural holiness.

Both Michael and Elizabeth graduated from Kentucky Mountain Bible College in 1973. They have three sons, eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

DAVID SPENCER



David and Nora Spencer had been at their home church for over 20 years when God began to speak to them about doing

church planting as a full-time ministry. God's calling was very clear, and they knew what He wanted them to do. After 23 years, the Spencers left their home church without any means of support, and God immediately began to bless their ministry, both spiritually and financially. God gave them a vision of 42 counties in Eastern Kentucky—there are approximately 970,000 people in these counties and approximately 670,000 unchurched people. A very needy place, the Spencers believe God wants good, biblically based churches in all these counties. They have developed an outreach program called The 2:42; corridor and beyond. It's based on Acts 2:42 and the 42 counties they atempt to reach. The Spencers both grew up in Eastern Kentucky and were both saved in 1983. Five years later David began pastoring his first church.
